## CALL FOR PAPERS

The project "Strengthening cross-border enforcement of judgments" financed by the German Federal Ministry for Economic Cooperation and Development (BMZ) and implemented by Deutsche Gesellschaft für Internationale Zusammenarbeit (GIZ) GmbH, Open Regional Funds for South East Europe-Legal Reform in cooperation with the International Union of Judicial Officers (UIHJ) and the South East European Law School Network (SEELS) is announcing a Call for Papers for a special edition of the SEE Law Journal devoted to the topic of cross-border enforcement in South East Europe. This call refers to the enforcement of judgements in civil and commercial matters.

The South East European Law Journal (SEE Law Journal) is a scientific English language journal of the South East European Law School Network (SEELS). The SEE Law Journal publishes high-quality original, double peer-reviewed scientific, review and professional articles focusing on relevant questions of regional, European and international integration of SEE countries, issues of legal reform and approximation with the *acquis communautaire*, best practices, in legal reform and unification of the legislation in the region of South East Europe and the EU.

We cordially invite the academic staff members and junior researchers (PhD students) of the SEELS network, as well legal researchers and legal professionals from South East European countries to submit their contributions for the SEE Law Journal. The authorship is restricted to maximum three co-authors per paper.

The papers should be focusing on:

- Civil Enforcement: Law and Practice in SEE countries
- The cross-border enforcement of civil and commercial decisions in SEE countries
- The HCCH 2019 Judgments Convention and its perspective for SEE countries
- The 2005 Hague Convention on Choice of Court Agreements and its perspective for SEE countries
